

The Western Ukraine Doctrine

A Vision for the First International Nation for Peace and Reconstruction

Executive Summary

The *Western Ukraine Doctrine* proposes a historic and peaceful initiative to create the world's first **International Nation** — a cooperative framework uniting nations through shared land, development, and humanitarian purpose. The doctrine envisions a **global network of 200 international territories**, each **750 square kilometers** in size, voluntarily allocated by participating nations as part of a coordinated **Western Ukrainian Land Partnership**.

This framework would collectively form a **150,000 square kilometer transnational system** of *Western Ukrainian International Regions* (WUIRs) — zones of peace, innovation, and reconstruction designed to preserve Ukrainian sovereignty, strengthen global alliances, and offer a new model of international solidarity.

Purpose and Rationale

Participating states — including all willing members of the European Union, the United States, and other partner nations — would each host a Western Ukrainian International Region within their borders. These regions would:

- Provide **airfields, housing, educational institutions, and industrial zones** for shared development.
- Operate under **special international governance**, harmonizing local and Ukrainian legal frameworks.
- Contribute **annual partnership fees or tax-sharing models** with host nations, ensuring mutual economic benefit.

Strategic Vision

The Doctrine introduces a new concept of “**distributed sovereignty**” — where a nation’s cultural and economic presence can expand across borders without displacing others. The 200-region network would:

- Create a **permanent international infrastructure** for Ukrainian resilience and reconstruction.
- Strengthen **Western unity** through shared investment and humanitarian cooperation.
- Provide a **diplomatic mechanism** to resolve territorial disputes by compensating Ukraine for losses through international partnership lands, rather than renewed conflict.
- Unite global youth, industries, and communities under the shared banner of rebuilding peace.

Implementation Pathway

1. **Founding Treaty:** Establishing the Western Ukraine International Compact (WUIC).
2. **Land Allocation Agreements:** Participating nations designate 750 sq km per region under special international status.
3. **Governance Structure:** Creation of the *Western Ukrainian International Council* to coordinate administration, funding, and diplomacy.
4. **Economic Integration:** Development of free-trade corridors, innovation centers, and humanitarian manufacturing hubs.
5. **Diplomatic Recognition:** Recognition of Western Ukraine as an *internationally distributed nation* with symbolic UN representation.
