**Subject: 3-Year Interim Constitutional Government + Civic Participation UBI Model**

**Scope: Political Stability, Economic Viability, Social Cohesion, Data Infrastructure Risk**

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# I. 3-Year Interim Government for Constitutional Drafting

## Mission Objective

- Draft and ratify a modern constitution within 36 months
  - Maintain continuity of governance
  - Preserve economic stability during transition
  - Prevent factional fragmentation
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## A. Structural Requirements

- Clear legal mandate defining interim authority
  - Fixed sunset clause (automatic expiration at 36 months)
  - Defined separation between drafting body and executive administration
  - Independent oversight body (judicial or civic)
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## B. Political Risk Factors

- Legitimacy challenges if selection mechanism is unclear
  - Elite capture of drafting process
  - Regional factional resistance
  - External geopolitical pressure
  - Perception of foreign influence
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## C. Stability Indicators to Monitor

- Inflation rate
  - Currency stability
  - Public protest frequency
  - Capital flight metrics
  - Energy export continuity
  - Military chain-of-command cohesion
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## D. Critical Success Conditions

- Transparent communication
- Visible drafting milestones every 90 days
- Public consultation cycles
- Inclusion across gender, ethnicity, class
- International legal observation (non-intrusive)

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## **E. Failure Triggers**

- Delays beyond 36 months
  - Economic collapse during transition
  - Exclusionary participation design
  - Fragmentation within armed forces
  - Perception of manipulated outcomes
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## II. Civic Participation UBI (\$30–\$60/day)

### Model Summary

- 30M participants
  - Digital tablet (“pad”) issued per participant
  - Daily compensation for constitutional engagement
  - Real-time data aggregation to central database
  - Live sentiment dashboards
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### A. Financial Scale

\$30/day × 30M = \$900M/day

\$60/day × 30M = \$1.8B/day

Annual range:

\$328B – \$657B

Key assessment:

- Exceeds realistic hydrocarbon revenue base
  - Would require external financing or massive price spikes
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### B. Economic Risk Profile

High inflation probability

Currency depreciation risk

Asset bubbles (real estate, imports)

Unsustainable fiscal burn rate

Potential sovereign debt spiral

Mitigation if implemented:

- Phased rollout
  - Partial savings lock mechanism
  - Domestic production scaling
  - Sovereign wealth fund buffer
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## C. Behavioral Effects

Positive:

- Immediate income surge
- Increased consumption
- Broad civic engagement
- Psychological inclusion

Negative:

- Dependency formation
- Reduced labor participation (short term)
- Speculative asset movement
- Regional inequality amplification

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## D. Data Infrastructure Assessment

### Operational Requirements

- Secure digital identity verification
  - Encrypted communication
  - Scalable cloud architecture
  - AI-based sentiment clustering
  - Tamper-resistant audit trail
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### Real-Time Sentiment Dashboard

Capabilities:

- Track attitudes toward:
    - Civic duties
    - Rights frameworks
    - Economic distribution models
    - Foreign policy alignment
  - Regional heat mapping
  - Demographic cross-tabulation
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### Strategic Risks

- Cyber intrusion
  - Data manipulation
  - Foreign interference
  - Internal bias in algorithm design
  - Loss of public trust if results appear curated
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### Data Governance Safeguards

- Open-source codebase
  - Third-party cybersecurity audits
  - Transparent algorithm logic
  - Publicly verifiable vote ledger
  - Separation of identity from opinion data
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# III. Public Sentiment in a Unipolar American World Order Context

## Assessment Variables:

- Desire for economic normalization
- Sovereignty sensitivity
- Sanctions fatigue
- National pride vs. integration
- Generational differences

## Likely Divisions:

### Urban younger demographics:

- Higher support for global integration
- Stronger economic reform preference

### Rural/traditional demographics:

- Higher sovereignty emphasis
- Greater suspicion of external alignment

## Key Risk:

- Framing the constitutional process as externally aligned could fracture support.

## Key Stability Approach:

- Emphasize domestic ownership
- Avoid geopolitical bloc framing
- Position constitution as sovereign modernization effort

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## IV. Strategic Viability Summary

### 3-Year Interim Government

Feasible if:

- Legitimacy clearly defined
- Economic stability preserved
- Strict time limitation enforced
- Broad inclusion guaranteed

High risk if:

- Perceived as externally engineered
  - Economic collapse occurs during transition
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### \$30–\$60 Civic UBI Model

Mathematically consistent

Economically unsustainable under current revenue structure

Inflation risk extremely high

Would require either:

- Massive export expansion
- Unrealistic oil pricing
- Large external capital injection

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## V. Overall Assessment

The constitutional drafting framework:

- Politically possible with legitimacy safeguards
- Economically sensitive but manageable

The large-scale daily UBI model:

- Symbolically powerful
  - Financially destabilizing at proposed scale
  - Would require substantial redesign for sustainability
